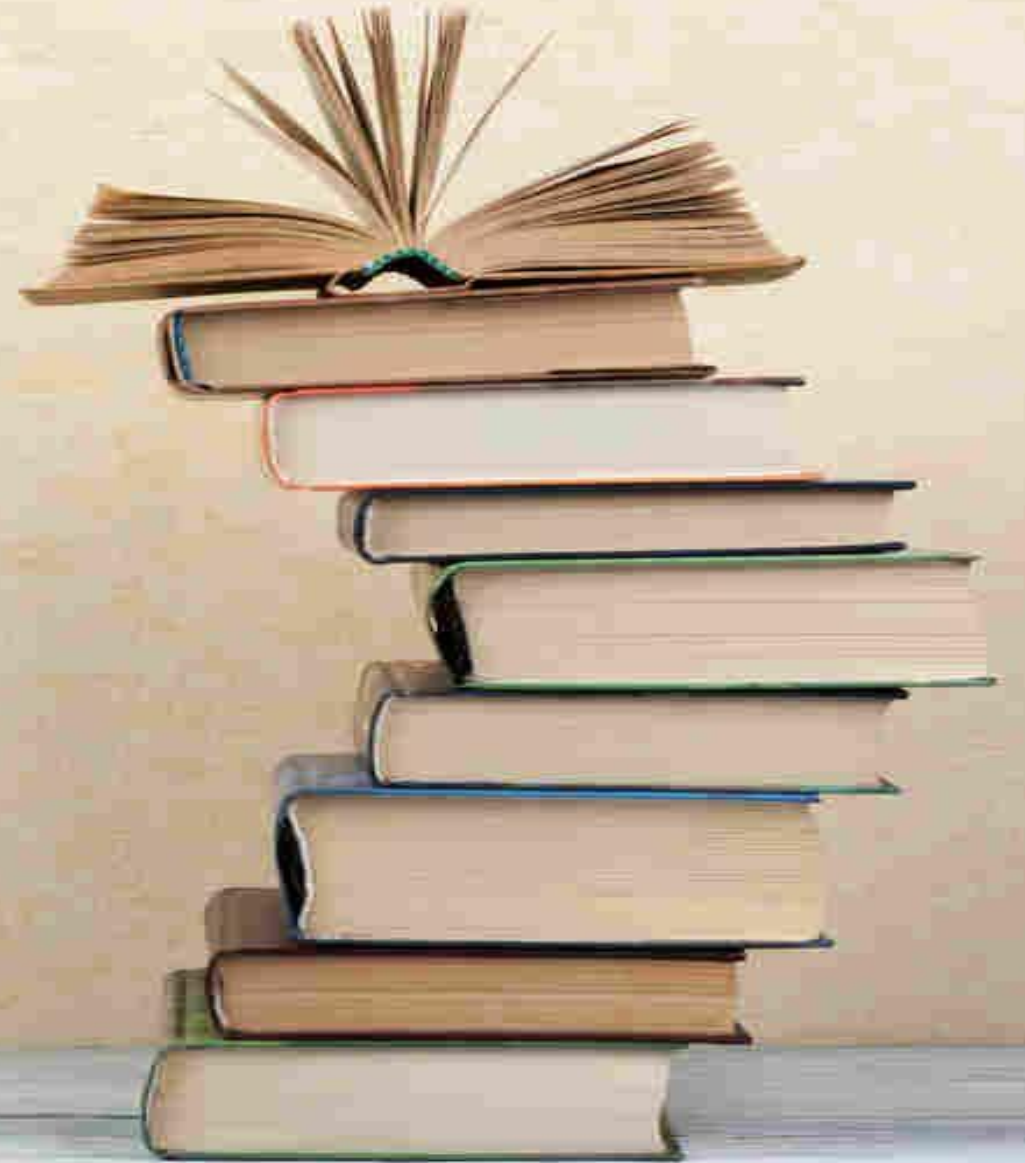


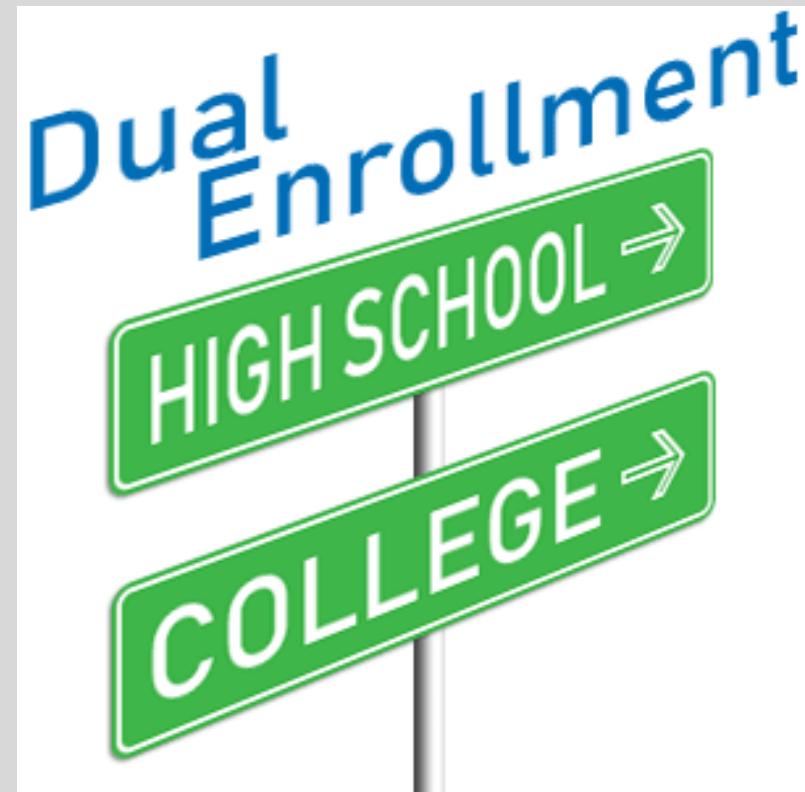
DUAL ENROLLMENT INFORMATION

2023 – 2024 SCHOOL YEAR



What is Dual Enrollment?

- College class taken while still in high school
- Counts as college credits and meets high school credit requirements
- May take a core class or an elective – the key is to make sure that it is a course that you will need in the future (school counselor can help you determine this)



What are Dual Enrollment courses like?

- Time requirements (8-10 hours/week per 3 credit course)
- Can affect graduation requirements
- We do not and cannot check your grades (no one will be holding your hand)
- You **MUST** be responsible and make sure you are paying your bill and completing your coursework.
- Grades will be on college transcript (grades are also listed on high school transcript, **NO** impact on rank or GPA)

Is Dual Enrollment right for me?

- Dual enrollment is open to motivated high school juniors and seniors.
- It is a challenging, enriching and rewarding experience.
- Are you a high achiever? Do you enjoy challenging yourself academically? Do you maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher?
- Do you have excellent time management skills?
- Do you want a real-world college experience?
- Are you considering pursuing a college degree in three years?
- Do you want to gain a head start on your academic and career goals?

How does this impact my schedule?

- Classes may be taken on campus or online (virtual or asynchronous)
 - Discuss pros and cons of options (transportation, internet access)
- Students may leave early/arrive late to high school if they have the transportation
 - Schedule determined by courses needed at high school and when college class are offered



- **COST:** \$150 per credit (The majority of courses are three credits, or a total of \$450 per course)
- **Eligibility:** Students must have at least 3.0 High School GPA and will need a recommendation from school counselor or teacher
- Complete online application (see packet with instructions)
- **Summer/Fall Registration Dates:**

Summer 2023 (Online)	Beginning of April	Summer I Session: May 14 th Summer II Session: July 2 nd
Fall 2023	1 st week of July	August 22, 2023
Spring 2024	1 st week of December	January 16, 2023



- **COST:** \$132.50 per credit (The majority of courses are three credits, or a total of \$397.50 per course)
- **Eligibility:** You do not need to take a math or English placement test if you have achieved one of the following grades/scores or higher.
- Complete online application (see packet with instructions)
- **Summer/Fall Registration Dates:**
Summer 2023 and Fall 2023
-March 29th for continuing students
-April 10th for new students

¹ Math scores must have been recorded within the past five years; eligible for MATH 100, 103, 104, 111, 113, 114 and 202

² For Math, High School GPA is valid from half-way through senior year or final transcript

³ English scores must have been recorded within the past 10 years; eligible for ENGL 101

****High School GPA is valid at mid-point of junior year.**

If you are exempt from math and English placement testing, you are eligible to enroll in college-level math and English courses.

Additional Information

- New Hope Scholarship – free and reduced lunch
- Dual-enrolled students are responsible for textbooks
- When you register for class, you need to pay for it before it starts, or you will be dropped
 - You will receive reminders/emails – **DO NOT** use northernpolarbears email account, use a personal email.
- Will my HACC or Messiah college credits transfer to another college?
 - Yes, courses can transfer to other institutions. Depending on the college and the course of study.
