Using a timeline approach, students will examine our nation's major writers, starting with authors from the colonial period, and ending with modern day literature. The literature we study will enhance reading comprehension, build vocabulary, encourage discussion, and provide another means of looking at the world.

This course utilizes a class textbook, *Adventures in American Literature*, and several full-length novels/dramas that include: *The Crucible*, *The Adventures of Huckleberry Finn*, *To Kill a Mockingbird*, *Of Mice and Men*, *The Great Gatsby*, and *Fahrenheit 451*. Class will also focus on the historical and cultural events surrounding our literature study.

Submit Assignments

Be on Time & Prepared

Come to class on time (tardiness reported after 1st full week) with your textbook and charged laptop. (*I will not have extra books or tech, including charging cables) Remain seated until the bell. *Have a pass if late.

I know stuff comes up, but success is a choice. Make it yours by doing the following:

Avoid distractions in class (cell phones, talking when I'm explaining something, etc.). ● If you're confused, ask for help. ● Save all assignments on your laptop **before** loading them into Schoology. ● Expect quizzes following a reading assignment. ● Ask for a library pass during my study hall (Period 7) *for the next day*. ● If you are absent, check Schoology for missed assignments. ● Don't talk over others. Raise your hand. ● Always bring your book to class unless I tell you otherwise. ● Any plagiarized assignment = 50% for 1st offense, and 0 thereafter. ● A positive attitude goes along way. So does kindness and respect. Remember this when contacting me or talking with your classmates.



Being able to present and share ideas is an important skill to learn for the "real world." You will have several formal presentations throughout the year, and you will use Microsoft Word, Google docs, and PowerPoint to do so. You may choose your presentation times, but once you select a date/time, you may not be able to make your presentation on a day other than your sign up-date. Excused absences are the only other reason for missing your presentation date. You may complete the presentation at an alternate date and time set up by me for half credit.

A legally binding agreement with the User to abide by your policies, and reduce liability for those providing web access.

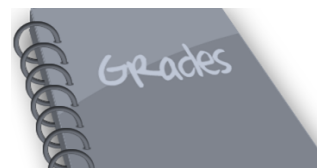
