Letter Formation- Automaticity

Direct and Explicit Handwriting Instruction

- ~Teach proper letter formation Using curriculum-based program such as Peterson or Handwriting Without Tears
- ~Group letters with similar stroke patterns
- ~Model proper number and letter formation using correct stroke sequence and directionality
- ~ Teach in the moment and correct reversals if they occur
- ~ Daily consistent practice

Develop Visual Memory Skills and Visual Attention

- ~Help to Develop a visual picture of letters
- ~Present each letter in a different color
- ~Play visual memory games using frequently reversed letters
- ~Provide an alphabet strip for desk
- ~Complete letter searches, word searches, picture searches ~ Read a paragraph and circle a specific letter
- ~Complete build -a -drawing activities to develop visual motor skills
- ~ Play Eye Spy and Spot-It games
- ~Play "What's Missing?" type games
- ~Engage in visual discrimination activities/matching/find the match (Blink, SET, Super Circles)
- ~Puzzles and visual problem-solving games

Develop Motor Memory

- ~Air writing using large whole arm movements
- ~ Write letters in carpet using finger
- ~ Rainbow writing using correct stroke sequence
- ~Practice letters using block and dot "Start at the dot and stay in the box"
- ~Wet, Dry, Try Handwriting Without Tears method
- ~Use tactile manipulatives such as Wiki Sticks or clay
- ~Use a sensory board with sandpaper, shaving cream, or sand to practice correct letter stroke sequence
