## Welcome to Elementary Band!

Elementary Band is for students who are excited to learn a woodwind, brass, or percussion instrument. Beginner students are those that are brand new to the program. Students returning to band in 5<sup>th</sup> grade are Advanced band students. ANYONE in 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade is welcome to play an instrument!

Mrs. Zampelli's mission is to help students discover their passion, purpose, and personal growth through the journey of learning an instrument. Band will be a place to learn, play, be safe and part of a community. Students are expected to listen, learn, respect others, try their best, commit to playing their instrument at school and at home (at least a little), make mistakes, try new things, and have FUN!

We will learn many musical elements such as note and rhythm reading, dynamics, expression and rehearsal and performance etiquette. Band promotes many life-long skills like teamwork, self-management, decision making, and learning from mistakes.

We will learn all these things in band Lessons and Full Band. Band Lessons are once a cycle with just a small group of students. Students will miss 25-30 minutes of the school day for lessons. Lessons will change every marking period so they do not miss the same class all year. Full Band meets once a cycle with all the students to put all the parts together and make amazing music! This meets during recess normally. This is like a puzzle and every student is important! I will give students and teachers a lesson schedule. Please make sure students know when their lessons are so they can come prepared with their instrument folder, instrument, and a great attitude.

Playing at home is so important to reinforce the topics we cover in Band. I only see students once a cycle, which does not allow for consistent playing habits. Students do need to play at home. A practice calendar will come home with their assignment and a suggested amount of practice per week (between 60-100 minutes normally). This needs to be signed by an adult. I will send the "tips and tricks to help your student play at home" information with the first lesson, so you can help your child learn and love their instrument!

#### **Concert Attendance**

When being part of the band, students are expected to participate in the concert. This is a great learning experience, even if you are nervous because we are a team and will help every member! If there is a planned vacation over a concert day, please let me know. If there is a sickness or other emergency the day of, please let me know. Sport practices should come second to our concert. We have only 2 nights a year for the band to perform and we ask that you make this the priority. If their sporting event is of great importance, like a championship, please let me know and we will try to work something out to participate in both events.

# **Band Expectations**

BAND will standing for Be Respectful (to everyone and equipment), Attitude Check (have positive things to say), Never Give Up (things might be hard but mistakes make us stronger), Do What You Need to Do (practice when you can, let me know if there are issues with practice or getting to lessons).

**"Grading"-** Band does not get official grades, but I will be keeping track of your students' Progress, Practice, and Attendance. There will be a report sent home through Seesaw each marking period to discuss each student's achievement in progress, practice, and attendance. Feel free to reach out whenever you have concerns or questions!

## **Band Reminders**

Communication will be through Seesaw. Each week, I will send home a reminder message that we have a lesson and/or Full Band Rehearsal the next day. For example, if your child has a lesson on Day 4, you will receive a message on the afternoon of Day 3 to remind you that your child has a lesson the next day.

## Band is a commitment!

Just like a sports team, band is a commitment for the entire year. Every student is important for the balance and blend of our music. I do ask for you and your student to commit to the entire school year for this activity.
