Curriculum Overview

Course: Explorations of Art

Grade Level: 8

Approval Date: October 2022 Length of Time: 45 days

Course Description: This elective course is designed to give 8th Grade students the opportunity to explore a variety of art applications. Students will develop art skills and knowledge beyond the basics. Through a wide variety of media, students will gain knowledge of drawing, painting, media process and techniques that artists use to create works of art.

Course Objectives:

- Know and use the elements and principles of each art form to create works in the arts and humanities.
- Recognize, know, use, and demonstrate a variety of appropriate arts elements and principles to produce, review, and revise original works in the arts.
- Communicate a unifying theme or point of view through the production of works in the arts.
- Analyze a work of art from its historical and cultural perspective.
- Analyze how historical events and culture impact forms, techniques, and purposes of works in the arts.
- Know and use the critical process of the examination of works in the arts and humanities.

- Compare and contrast informed individual opinions about the meaning of works in the arts to others

Learning Activities:

- Warm up drawing
- Memory vs. Observational Drawings
- Sketchbook/Visual Journals making sketches of ideas, document the creative process along the way and reflect before completely being done with a work of art.
- Be able to accept and give feedback to peers and/or teacher to make the reflection process successful.
- Peer Critiques
- Using new/unique materials or using everyday materials in a new way.

Performance Tasks:

- Successful completion of drawings of objects.
- Successful completion of times observation drawings.
- Sketches and other evidence in planning and revisions of artwork for project.
- Ongoing peer and teacher feedback during the making of the artwork.
- Artwork demonstrating understanding and competencies of techniques and processes.
- Written reflections by student to explain techniques used to help create the artwork.
