## Writing Practice:

Writing is most meaningful when it's relevant and authentic.

- Make cards or write letters to send to family members sharing your home adventures.
- Allow your child to help with writing out a grocery or chore list.
- Try something fun like building a leprechaun trap at home for Saint Patrick's Day. Everyday items such as a cup, blocks, books or popsicle sticks make great trap materials. Your child can write a story about his/her adventure trapping the leprechaun.
- Write a personal narrative about a fun activity during this time at home.
  - We are working hard on using a capital letter at the beginning of a sentence, leaving spaces between words, and ending each sentence with a punctuation mark.
- Make a journal for your child to write about their everyday adventures.
- If you plant seeds, have your child draw and write about how the seeds grow over the days.
- Making books can be tons of fun for children! Staple some construction paper together. Have your child pick a topic (trucks, insects, etc.) and write pages that pertain to that topic.
