Subject: Small Arms Trade Proposed by: South Korea

## The General Assembly

<u>Acknowledging</u> that small arms and other light weapons appear to be extremely prevalent in all forms of crime and conflict,

Aware that some of these arms are acquired illegally through gangs and other criminal organizations,

Noting that some nations have only established weak guidelines regarding whom they domestically provide weapons to,

<u>Further noting</u> that many of these same nation's have weak guidelines regarding the exportation of these weapons to international governments and organizations,

## Resolves:

- 1. <u>Calls upon</u> nations currently affected by the illegal arms trade to work together in preventing the illegal sale and acquisition of these weapons in the hopes of increasing regional control of small arms and other weapons.
- 2. <u>Invites</u> the United Nations to promote thorough international guidelines on the sale of small arms and other weapons between nations.
- 3. <u>Calls upon</u> nations within the United Nations to create strict requirements controlling the sale of small arms to citizens within their nations hopefully creating a safer environment within all countries.
- 4. <u>Proposes</u> that the United Nations consider creating a database in which the production of and all transactions involving small arms would be recorded. Although currently this idea is not plausible it could hold future potential to help solve many problems posed and created by the trade of small arms both domestically and internationally.
